New Business

- 1.) Parent Club, Board Meetings and All-4-Fun meetings are moving in 2015 to the Westminster Elks Lodge. We have outgrown the Maple Grove Grange and fire code for the Grange has been maxed out for Parent Club on several meetings. We will not enter through the main lodge doors. Enter on the EAST side of the building and go downstairs to the meeting room.
- 2.) Alex Campbell presented the proposed budget for 2015. He highlighted budget to actual from 2014 is within 3%. The biggest variable is All-4-Fun. Insurance was increased from 2014 to 2015.

- ★ Ken Moul moved to not do a ballot vote and do a show of hands. Mike Bowden seconded the motion. Cory called for a show of hands and the majority was for approving the proposed budget for 2015.
- e. Cory presented the Christmas Dinner Dance needed an additional \$2000 for the event as in the past the funds made from the event were used on the event. This was incorrect accounting. Shannon Ross was planning on spending the income totaling the Chrismas Dinner Dance expense of \$7000, not the \$5000 budgeted.




