





Craig welded my hitch back together with some pretty good welds. Also he took something home, he welded together, from some scrap metal. Not sure what it was or is. He liked it! All that matters.

Thanks Craig!

The 1973 Jeep CJ5 is now in two pieces.

Most of the body mounts do not match the newer frame. Only the back two. One is gone from age. Next step is to cut out all the rusted panels and weld in replacements.

Each piece will be cut to fit with plasma cutter. Hot, hot, hot..over 50,000 degrees.

Also making new tub supports with body mounts to match 24 inches longer frame. The tub will also be 24 inches longer, when finished.

Also working on my old CJ 5 gas can holder. Adding 1/2 inch to hold down to help remove gas can, when needed.

Tip of the day: when welding, always take time to prep the steel clean from rust and paint.






